



# A picture is worth a thousand words



The human brain is optimized to look at visual objects and not text, so a picture will draw the interviewer's attention, especially when it comes to human faces that transmit a lot of information about the person

## **Diversity and uniqueness**

Most resumes resemble themselves in format - and better yet - it is important that the text fit the conventional format, so attaching your photo to the resume provides the document with the uniqueness that the photo will make the resume memorize and, if needed, easily find and resume your resume Haim

## **What a picture to attach**

The image must be the size of a passport image - do not exceed and place an image that is too large or too small

The photo should have a torso (from chest area and above)

It is highly desirable that there should be no background at all meaning that a white background or a neutral background does not require any additional objects

It is important that the dress and hairstyle be appropriate and respectable

And your expression will be respectful and formal - a possible smile is possible

Such an image can be done in photography stores

By the way, the image guidelines outlined here also fit your picture on social networks like Facebook since employers may be looking for information on the web for you.

### **Location**

Place your image on the top left of the resume document so you keep the accepted format (so as not to confuse the interviewer)

And avoid distorting the document - due to differences between the versions of computer systems and vending machines for sorting and filing CVs

### **seniors**

The recommendation to include a photo in the CV for older job seekers - (in relation to the acceptable age of the job they are aiming for) is usually a necessity for older people hard to reach even a job interview they already fall into the CV screening phase - attaching a photo in such a case often helps sort out the stage. The document because the picture proves that this is not an elderly person - today 40-year-olds are sometimes considered too mature, but when you see their picture you have a completely different image

### **In conclusion**

If you are looking for a job go to a nearby photo shop make sure you have a quality photo and apply for it on CD as well as a printed copy, incorporate it in the resume document from the top left and send suitable required ads - will improve your chances of getting the job interview and certainly won't hurt
